## Letter From The Director

This fall, it is important for you to review the personal voter registration information that our office has on file for you. To check your information, follow these simple steps:

Go to the My Voter Page website located at <http://www.mvp.sos.ga.gov> in your web browser.

Input the first letter of your first name, your full last name, county of residence and your date of birth and press the "Submit" button.

Upon completing these steps, you will be taken to your personal page where you can see the name, address and date of birth that we have in our records for you.

If something needs to be changed, you will need to fill out a new voter registration application to ensure that we have updated information by Election Day.

It is very important that you take the time to check your information using these steps listed above. This November's General Election is sure to be very busy. We encourage you to ensure that your records are accurate and therefore that you will be voting within the correct district and precinct.

The voter registration deadline for this November's General Election is **October 9, 2018**.

## Change of Address: A Simple Process



Address changes with the United States Postal Service do not apply to or update your voter registration.

- ◆ **If your address is within Chatham County, fill out and submit a new voter registration application to our office in person or by mail. Or go online to the My Voter Page at <http://www.mvp.sos.ga.gov> to complete a new application.**
- ◆ **If you move to another county in Georgia, fill out a voter registration application in your new county of residence or do so at the My Voter Page website (<http://www.mvp.sos.ga.gov>).**
- ◆ **If you move out of the State of Georgia, contact your local Registrar's office for instructions on registering in your new location.**
- ◆ **If you have a change in your name, you should also complete a new registration application.**

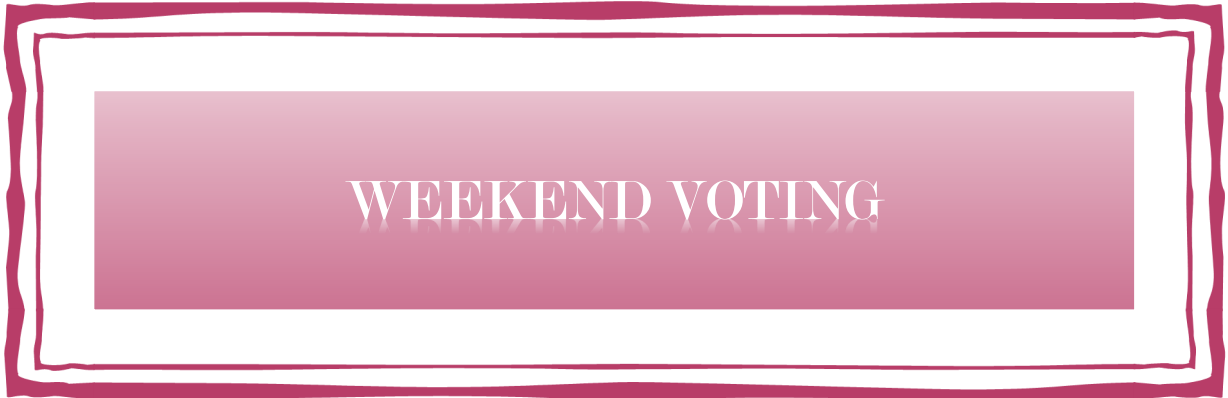

Who is a UOCAVA voter?

UOCAVA (Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act) voters are active military personnel, their spouses and dependents, as well as civilian Georgia voters who are temporarily or permanently residing overseas.

In addition to the option to have a ballot mailed out, a UOCAVA voter also has the option of having their ballot sent to them via e-mail delivery. To receive a ballot via e-mail, a UOCAVA voter must indicate this desire on their written absentee ballot request.

## **Georgia Voter ID Requirements: What Forms of ID Are Acceptable To Use For Voting?**

- Any valid state or federal government issued photo ID, including a free ID Card issued by your county registrar's office or the Georgia Department of Driver Services (DDS)
- A Georgia Driver's License, even if expired
- Valid employee photo ID from any branch, department, agency, or entity of the U.S. Government, the State of Georgia, or any county, municipality, board, authority or other entity of this state.
- Valid U.S. passport ID
- Valid U.S. military photo ID
- Valid tribal photo ID

## College Corner

Check your voter registration status at <http://www.mvp.sos.ga.gov> to confirm your county of registration and make sure to contact your county of registration with any questions or concerns you have about the voting process.

College students are reminded that, if you are registered to vote in another Georgia county besides Chatham, you will need to cast your vote in that county or request an absentee ballot from your home county.

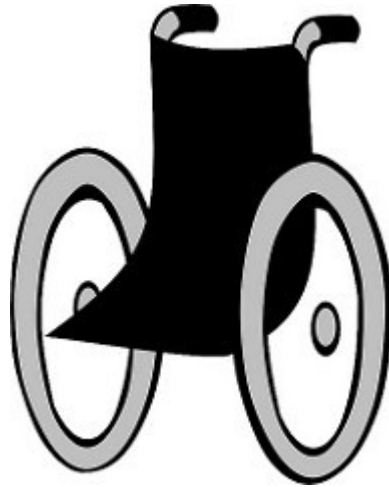

### *Voters With Disabilities*

Please see important information below regarding accommodations available to voters with disabilities while casting a ballot:

- \* A voter who is unable to sign their name, see or mark a ballot, operate the voting machine or who cannot enter the voting booth without assistance can receive assistance to do so. The individual assisting the voter must sign that voter's voter certificate.
- \* Accessible touch screen voting machines are available with the goal of having a disabled individual vote independently and privately. There are several different ways to cast a ballot on these machines. An audio ballot is available that allows the voter to hear candidate names and questions through headphones. Magnifying the ballot is also available on the voting machine.
- \* Any voter can request a mail-in ballot. No reason is required. A disabled voter who has requested a mail-in ballot can receive assistance to complete a mail-in ballot. As with voting in person, the person assisting the voter must sign. For mail-in ballots, the person assisting would sign the back of the yellow ballot return envelope in the space provided.
